Biblical Giving (2 Corinthians 8-9)

- 8:1 Giving is a manifestation of God's grace in our lives
- 8:2 Giving is for all believers regardless of their **financial** status
- 8:2-3 The magnitude of a gift is measured by the <u>ability</u> of the giver to give rather than the actual amount
- <u>8:4</u> Giving is the responsibility and <u>privilege</u> of our fellowship with other believers
- <u>8:5</u> Supernatural giving involves giving one's <u>self</u> before giving one's substance
 - Biblical giving flows from a life that is yielded to **God**.
- 8:6-7 It is not unbiblical to <u>appeal</u> to God's people to participate in a ministry of giving
- <u>8:8-9</u> Giving is an expression of the <u>sincerity</u> of one's love Giving is a way in which we <u>imitate</u> our Lord Jesus Christ
- 8:10-12 Giving begins with a <u>desire</u> to be involved, and a <u>decision</u> before God to follow through according to one's ability
- 8:13-15 The principle of equality should inform our giving
- <u>8:16-23</u> The principle of <u>integrity</u> should inform our giving
- <u>9:1-5</u> Don't allow covetousness to override <u>faith</u>.
- <u>9:6</u> God's blessing is <u>proportional</u> to my giving patterns
- <u>9:7</u> Giving is to be voluntary from a personal <u>conviction</u>. God wants me to give with <u>joy</u>, not with regrets or stress
- 9:8-9 Giving in this way guarantees the **provision** of God
- 9:10-12 Giving is an act of faithful worship/service that results in:
- 1) Multiplied righteousness / blessing from God
- 2) Thanksgiving to God from those who benefit from our gift
- 9:13-14 Giving glorifies God as a testimony of the gospel
- <u>Phil. 4:14-17</u> There *is* <u>profit</u> to our account when we invest wisely in the gospel work
- Application: What ministries and how much?
